A Message From Principal Jennifer Marsh

Welcome back from spring break! The fourth and final quarter is here and we have lots to do before the end of our school year. On March 28th, we began our annual round of required state assessments. Sixth graders will be taking both ELA and math assessments. Seventh graders will be taking ELA, math, and social studies assessments. Eighth graders will be taking ELA, math, and science assessments.

Students are encouraged to "show what they know," giving their very best effort on these assessments. Each school receives a specific performance rating based upon the combined individual scores from each student as well as the overall participation rate by the student body. This rating is then reported to the school and the school district by the State of Colorado. In addition, schools consider the scores on these assessments to help determine where the student is at in his or her academics, using this as data to help ensure that the instruction the student is receiving in their classrooms is being delivered at the appropriate level. As students get older, this data is also used to determine which classes would be most appropriate for our students.

The testing schedule is as follows

- Sixth grade will be assessed March 28th to March 30th
- Seventh grade will be assessed April 4th to April 6th and April 14th
- Eighth grade will be assessed April 18th to April 20th and April 25th.

We have scheduled the assessments to be held in the mornings only and have developed a schedule that promotes as normal a day as possible. If you would please give these dates your consideration in scheduling any out of school appointments for your child. While an extra morning snack will be provided each day of the assessment, we also encourage students to eat a healthy and nutritious breakfast to help them give their very best effort.

Along with students taking the annual state assessment, the track season has begun, and our performing arts students are preparing for the Colorado West Festival on April 20th and 21st. All of our students have been working hard and I expect they will do well in all of these areas.

The class of 2021, our current 8th graders will begin their transition to high school. As we are a direct feeder to Central High School, all transition activities will be with done with CHS staff and students. To kick off the transition, our 8th grade students attended


Book Review
